## **Songs of Innocence and of Experience - Blake 2.0**

Songs of Innocence was first printed in 1789 and, when he composed Songs of Experience in 1794, Blake typically issued them in combined form as Songs of Innocence and of Experience, though he also made the Songs of Innocence available on their own until 1818 There are 32 surviving copies of Songs of Innocence and 29 copies of the combined
